Brief B INSTANT PICNIC PACK

Key stage 3

Background

Polythene is a plastic material that is very versatile. It is used in many of our day to day food and non food packaged products. It can be used for plastic bags, films or as hard rigid plastic containers. It is a material that is easily recycled by collecting the waste and regrinding it into granules so that it can be re-melted and blown into new film.

Resume of the brief

Your brief is to design and produce an environmentally friendly 'Instant Picnic Pack.' The Pack is to contain compostable knives, forks, plates, cups and serviettes. At the end of the picnic – no need to mess around clearing up – just bundle the whole pack into the original bag or container you have designed, and put it on the compost heap, even with the food leftovers.

75% of the pack must be polythene but you may use a degradable carton board for 25% of the pack if you think appropriate. This will help to give it structure, form and stability on the shelf. You may develop your own branding and graphics for the pack.

British Polythene Industries Award of £400 to the school which in the opinion of the judges has had the greatest success with its pupil's entries.
